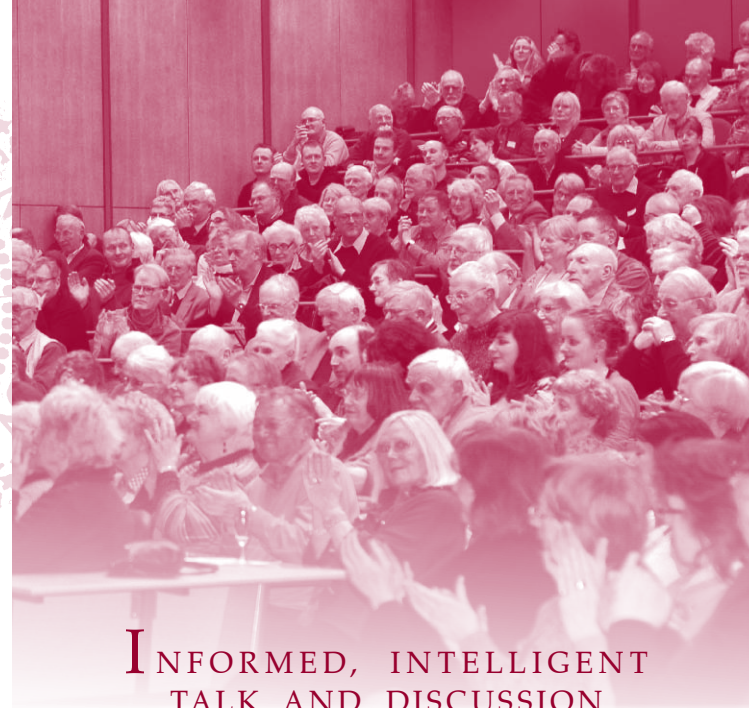
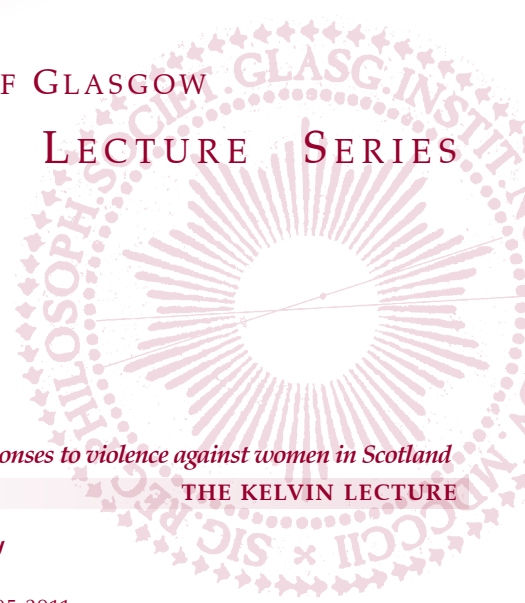

# ACCESS

Meetings take place in The John Anderson Building which is in the pedestrianised area between Rottenrow and Rottenrow East. Entry is through glass doors on either side and the lecture theatre is down one level at level 3. Disabled access is by lift from ground level.

**SATNAV:** use postcode G4 0NG

**By FOOT:** 10 minutes brisk walk from Queen St Station.

**From Cathedral St,** turn into the campus along Taylor St, at the barrier.

**From Rottenrow,** enter pedestrianised area with Business School on left, follow path in front of Architecture Building; the John Anderson Building is ahead to your right.

**By BUS:** There are many bus routes along Cathedral St and High St.

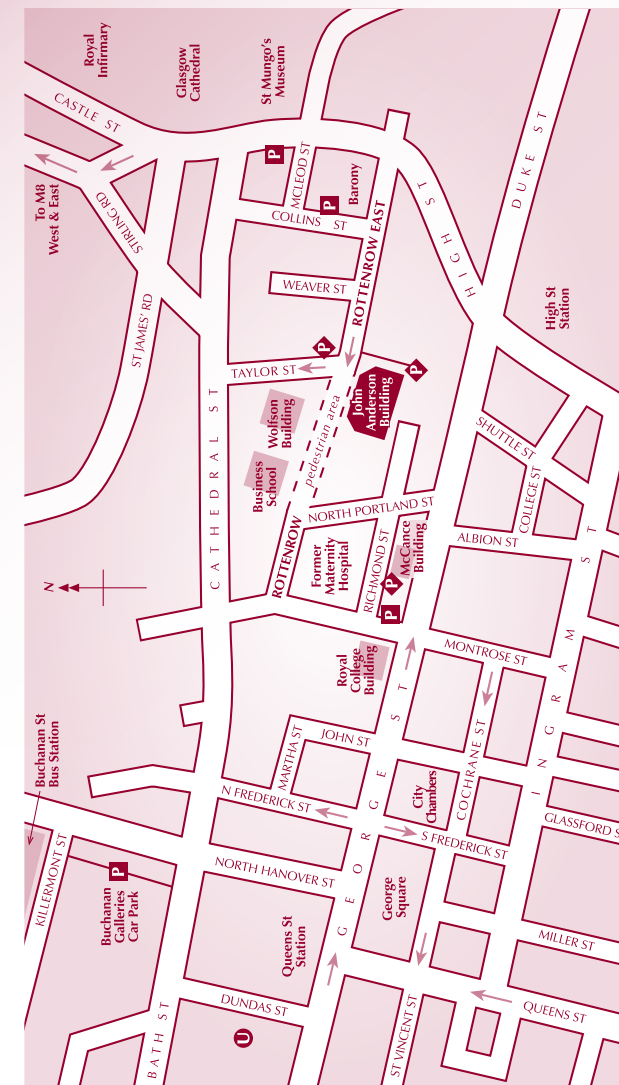
**By VEHICLE:**

**From Cathedral,** turn into Rottenrow East at Barony, and park in Collins St (free after 6pm) or go through open barrier to pedestrian area and park behind John Anderson Building.

**From George St,** turn left up Montrose St or North Portland St and park on street or in McCance Building car park (enter from Richmond St).
